Miaoli District Prosecutors Office Partners with National Immigration Agency

Legal Outreach for New Immigrants

Jointly Promoting Anti-Bribery and Law Education

With local public official elections scheduled for November 28 this year, the Miaoli District Prosecutors Office aimed to help new immigrants gain a deeper understanding of Taiwan's democratic electoral system, establish correct legal concepts, and jointly maintain clean election practices. Lin Ying-zi, Chief Prosecutor of the Miaoli District Prosecutors Office, specially assigned Chief Probation Officer Tsai Hsin-hua to collaborate with the Miaoli County Service Center of the National Immigration Agency under the Ministry of the Interior on the 29th to host the "Legal Appointment with New Immigrants" legal awareness event. Through relatable and easy-to-understand methods, the event educated new immigrant friends on legal knowledge regarding anti-vote-buying and anti-fraud efforts, aiming to jointly create a clean, safe, and friendly living environment.

During the event, Chief Officer Tsai Hsin-hua used real-life cases to explain common forms of vote-buying, reminding new immigrant friends not to break the law for temporary gain, while encouraging the public to report illegal acts and jointly safeguard democratic values. In addition, she analyzed fraud techniques that have frequently emerged in recent years—such as fake investments, fake online auctions, fake online dating, and impersonations of government agencies. She reminded new immigrants to remain vigilant when encountering suspicious situations, keep in mind the anti-fraud principle of "1. Listen, 2. Hang up, 3. Verify," and call the 165 Anti-Fraud Hotline for verification to avoid falling into scam traps.

New immigrants are vital members of Taiwanese society. The Miaoli District Prosecutors Office hopes this legal campaign helps new immigrants better understand Taiwan's legal system and their own rights, enhance their legal literacy, and establish correct concepts regarding anti-vote-buying and anti-fraud awareness. By partnering

with the National Immigration Agency, legal education is brought deeper into communities, empowering new immigrants to become an important force in maintaining fair elections and preventing fraud while integrating into Taiwanese life.

As this year coincides with the 9-in-1 local public official elections, maintaining a clean election requires the collective efforts of all citizens. The Miaoli District Prosecutors Office appeals to the public: if you discover any suspected vote-buying activities, please call the anti-vote-buying reporting hotline at **0800-024-099** (press 4 after connecting) to file a report. The maximum reporting reward is **NT\$20 million**, and the identity of the informant will be kept strictly confidential. It is hoped that through cooperation between the government and the public, we can jointly create a clean electoral environment, a safe life, and a happy home.
